#### ... From the "Nest"

#### Singing Hymns

#### The "Healthful" side of . . .!

A couple of weeks ago (my, does time fly!) I began writing about the "healthful" sides of hymn-singing. And, here I am again! Engaging in our discussion of hymn-singing its many healthful benefits. The first two spoke to the "physical" activity of singing. Singing engages us to think, feel, and believe! Aloud!



Have y'all been practicing the "healthful' benefits of hymn-singing since my last "nest" note to you? We've checked into the "physical," "emotional," "thoughtful," and the "instructive" sides. Now, let us look at the "memorable," "personal," and the "corporate" sides of "healthful" hymn-singing (overall, singing in general).

"Memorable" hymn-singing works in several different ways. On the one hand, a particular hymn may remind us of important events from our own past: a significant occasion such as a wedding (I sang, from the rear of the church Helen and I were married in, O Perfect Love-a special arrangement but nonetheless a "hymn" and "memorable!"), or a person who was dear to us. More than that, we are linked with all of God's people, perhaps especially when we use hymns based on Biblical events: we enter into the experience of the Psalmists. Hymns also create memories as they lodge themselves through repeated use; they become a hidden source of spiritual strength which provides physical and mental resolve in times of difficulty or give us the words that enable words which express our feelings on any given occasion.

As we express our joy or sadness, we become personally attached. Many hymns are written in the first person singular, and their writers invite us to make a personal expression of praise or prayer. (Faith?) The same remains true of those hymns which are the plural: "we" as signers comprise a number of individuals, and if "we" praise God that should indicate that each of us individually is doing so.

Thirdly, hymn-singing is "corporate." As above, we sing hymns in a congregation, we join with others to share what we have in common: our Christian faith. Together we express what we each believe and experience. Sometimes that corporate expression touches some people more than others: one hymn may enable me to stand with others in their expression of joy and celebration, while another will help those who share my sadness to join with me in lament. The act of singing together helps us to bear each other's burdens, etc.

"We are one in the Spirit, we are . . .!!" You're feeling it now!

#### **FESTIVAL OF SHARING**

The annual Festival of Sharing is a cooperative response to hunger, poverty, and injustice in Missouri and beyond. These concerns motivate our actions to raise awareness of root causes and encourage solutions. Their goal is to promote and support projects and programs by



providing funding and resource goods. When people of faith came together and share, we can make a positive and powerful difference in the lives of our neighbors.

Festival of Sharing has various packs and kits which they collect. In the past, we brought items for cleaning kits that were used after floods and disasters. This year, our Disciples Women's Ministries group has chosen the Missouri Women's Prison Packs as their project. The kits will be given to women who are facing a challenging time in their lives. In Missouri, women who are incarcerated in prison must purchase their own personal hygiene items. Many women do not have the financial resources to be able to buy needed items such as toothpaste, toothbrush, shampoo, deodorant, sanitary napkins, tampons, etc.

Rather than bringing items, we are asking for donations to provide the items for the Prison Kits. Festival of Sharing purchases the approved supplies in bulk and then kits are assembled that meet the state prison regulations. Each individual kit cost \$10. If you would like to donate to our project, please mark your check or offering envelope "Festival of Sharing" or "Prison Packs". Donations are needed by the end of October. Thank you in advance for sharing your Christian Love with those in need.

#### SHELTER IN A STORM/PANTRY OF BLESSINGS

Friday after the Anti-Racism class and everyone had left, I stayed to do some personal work on my phone. The church phone rang and I answered, "Lake Ozark Christian Church". The conversation from there went -

Him-I understand you have a food pantry.

Me-Yes we do. It is open 24/7.

**Him**-There is a man in Osage Beach who needs some food. He is at a motel there and was given a card telling about your pantry.

Me-Where are you calling from?

**Him-***MOCA.* (Missouri Ozarks Community Action from somewhere else, not the Lake). Will the church be open for a while?

**Me**-Actually we're not open now. I just happen to be here, but the pantry is open 24/7.

**Him-**This guy needs to get a ride so there's no way he can get the food tonight?

**Me**-The Pantry is open 24/7. I would go get him but I'm alone and don't think it is safe for a woman to do that.

**Him-**Oh, no. He can get a ride, but is your Pantry inside the church?

**Me**-No, it's outside the church under the portico in a grey tall cabinet.

**Him**-Oh wow! So, he can access the food even when the church is closed?

**Me**-Yes, any time. We also have toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, band-aids, and other things. He can help himself. **Him**-Oh wow!! I will call him and tell him.

**Me**-Tell them to come to the side under the portico or drivethru and look for the grey cabinet. They can't miss it. And for your information for any future callers, we can provide up to 2 nights in a motel and we also have gas cards. Both those things do have to be done in our office during the time we are open.

#### Oh wow!

Our Pantry of Blessings continues to be a blessing to many. If you want to contribute, there is a basket in the hall in front of the sanctuary where you can leave items. If you want to contribute cash, please mark it "Pantry" and put in the Little Church in the same area. We are blessed to be able to help others and to receive their prayers for us. Thanks be to God. **Oh wow!!**
