... From the "Nest"

Singing Hymns The "Healthful" side of . . .!"

A couple of weeks ago (my, does time fly!) I began writing about the "healthful" sides of hymn-singing. Engaging in singing has many healthful benefits. The first two spoke to the "physical" activity of singing. Singing engages us to think, feel, and believe! Aloud!

Secondly, singing engages our "emotional" focus. Words come alive when set to music taking one to another level of attachment in their relationship to Christ.



Additionally, hymn-singing is "thoughtful!" It is, of course, all too easy to mouth familiar words without thinking about their meaning. Yet, when sung properly, a hymn should engage the singer's(worshipper's) mind and intellect. In part this is a matter of understanding what is said, it also involves a dialogue (just like we are dialoguing scripture through "reader's theatre") between the singer and the text (Do I believe this? Is this what I want to pray, praise, to admit? What should I "do" if this is how I see things?) Words are put into action becoming a vehicle of genuine adoration, petition, or re-commitment. A well-chosen hymn almost compels singers to respond at just the right point in a broader act of worship.

Hymn-singing is also "instructive." Some hymns are narrative in form; they remind us of the(a) biblical story and draw us into it. Others are expressive of what we may want to say to God, giving us focused words to do so. A good hymn will express in clear, unambiguous terms the thoughts which were loitering in our minds, providing us with phrases and vocabulary which enable us to say: "Yes, that is just what I mean!"

"Just as I am, without one plea . . . I come to thee!"
