The LORD descended in the cloud and stood with him there and proclaimed the name, "The LORD." The LORD passed before him and proclaimed,

a God merciful and gracious,
slow to anger,
and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness,
keeping steadfast love for the thousandth generation,
forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin,
yet by no means clearing the guilty,
but visiting the iniquity of the parents
upon the children

to the third and the fourth generation."

-Exodus 34:5-7

This description of God occurs often in the Hebrew Testament. The Great I AM comes before Moses, declaring this explanation of God, who God is, and what God is all about. It is comforting to know that the Lord leads with grace. Mercy and grace--this is the fundamental nature of God, and the Lord follows that up with being slow to get angry. Thank God for that! Whenever the Lord seems slow to respond to a problem or prayer, let us remind ourselves how patient God is with us! God then offers more blessing. Our Lord abounds in steadfast love--pure, unconditional, everlasting love, and the Lord is absolutely faithful. Steadfast love and faithfulness is actually one word in Hebrew. It's translated love *and* faithfulness because the word encompasses both. In God, steadfast love and faithfulness are forever linked. God does indeed forgive, but the Lord reminds us that sin always has consequences. The Lord forgive but cannot make it like it never happened, and unfortunately, some of our sins have lasting consequences even to the third and fourth generation.





## Highlights from the Leadership Council Meeting on September 28, 2023

- After the last council meeting, Pastor Ron worked with Barb Davis to make the necessary edits and revisions to the proposed changes to our constitution and bylaws. He also looked at the building use and wedding policies. He has started leading monthly worship services at Stonecrest.
- Pastor Ron reports that the new after-school program on Wednesdays is doing well, and several people have been helping. It does take up several hours of Pastor Ron's time, as he writes the Amos skits for the kids, setting the theme of the day. There also structured crafts and activities. We are providing an excellent ministry to these kids.
- Treasurer Matt Redd said the church is running at a deficit of over \$20,000, but he believes we will hopefully make that up in the
  next few months. We did note that, compared to last year, we have increased our general fund contributions by about \$4,000 thus
  far
- We decided that we would try passing the plates for offering again, starting in November. The Elders and Deacons will need to be informed. We discussed also passing trays for communion, but decided to table that decision.
- Donna Foster will be the lead person on our trunk our treat event, which will be held October 28, from 2-4pm.
- We went through the proposed changes to the bylaws again. Points were clarified and we made some minor edits and revisions. The council approved the proposed changes to the bylaws as revised. A simple version will be shared with the congregation. A blue/red version clearly showing changes will also be made available upon request. At the next potluck at the end of October, we will invite any who have questions or comments to sit at a table with people from the committee. The congregation will vote upon these proposed changes at the November meeting.
- We looked again at the building use agreement. We also considered weddings for nonmembers and looked into updating and
  modifying our wedding policy. After much discussion, we decided to table our discussion until next meeting. For outside
  weddings, we would like to have someone serve as a wedding liaison. Different than a wedding coordinator, this person would
  represent the church when dealing with the wedding party.

### TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE NEWS

The LOCC Transportation Ministry began approximately 4 years ago. Initially, the primary purpose was to assist members of LOCC by providing rides to medical, dental, and physical therapy appointments in Lake Ozark, Osage Beach, Camdenton, Eldon, Jefferson City, and Columbia. A second purpose was to provide rides to members needing transportation assistance in order to attend services at LOCC.

A survey of LOCC's membership was conducted and many members offered to provide transportation to one (1) or more of the locations listed above. Over time, several of our original group of volunteers have relocated, had changes in their family, or unfortunately passed away. This has created a much smaller "pool" of volunteers.

As a result, we are once again asking for volunteers to provide transportation to locations. Please consider helping us by selecting one (1) or more locations on the sign-up sheet at the information table so we can continue to assist LOCC church members.

Many people in our area have storms of life and need some help. Through this ministry, we are able to help them by providing food and toiletry items, gas cards, and emergency short-term lodging or long-term housing assistance. A client who uses our Food Pantry, came to our church during our Annual Rummage Sale in need of a couple pair of jeans (as he only owned a pair of jeans that were very worn) and a razor to shave his beard. We were able to give him some nicelooking jeans, a razor and shaving cream. These items that we had in stock put a smile on his face and helped him feel better going to his new job. **OUR NEEDS FOR OCTOBER:** Because a Food Drive was held on September 30th, we are not asking for any specific food items this month. Cash donations are extremely encouraged to sustain this ministries' work to provide our clients food, gas cards, and/or lodging assistance.
