- Shelter in a Storm has requested being part of the church budget. Up to now, this ministry has been funded directly by donations. There was some discussion about moving this ministry into our regular church operating budget. Audrey Tanner has been invited to attend our next meeting to discuss this ministry.
- Pastor Ron thanked everyone for helping to celebrate his recent wedding and all the support the church has shown with his marriage.
- Pastor Ron shared the plan for closing church in case of inclement weather. A decision (at the latest) will be made by 8:30am Sunday morning, and the information will be passed on via Website, KRCG Channel 13, Facebook and an email.
- In case of icy weather, salt may be needed on sidewalks. Property Chair Matt Bentz has agreed to take care of this. If he is not available others may need to assist. The ice melt has been placed in the hallway by the portico door and fellowship hall.
- We will be starting a Sunday School class for preschool age kids (age 3-5) during the 10:30 am worship service. The kids will begin in the sanctuary, and after a children's moment with Amos Mouse, will go to class. Two people (a teacher and a helper) will be with the kids. A curriculum may be purchased.

Over time, several of our original group of volunteers have relocated, had changes in their family, or unfortunately passed away. This has created a much smaller "pool" of volunteers.

## Have you ever had a "storm" in your life?

Many people in our area have storms of life and need some help. Through this ministry, we are able to help them by providing food and toiletry items, gas cards, and/or emergency short-term lodging or long-term housing assistance. During the frigid cold temperatures in January, the "Shelter in a Storm" ministry has provided four people warmth by paying for extended stays in local hotels for them. One client was in between in-patient rehabilitation services and a surgery he needed, successfully stating that he has been clean for 30 days! Another couple lives in a camper and were out of money to buy propane as their car broke down and they needed their money for an expensive part. The car was needed to earn their income. This ministry also paid for a deposit so a low-income senior apartment fire victim could move into a new apartment. Because of your cash donations, we were able to help these neighbors through their personal storm. Thank you!

OUR NEEDS FOR FEBRUARY: cereal and toothpaste. Cash donations are also extremely encouraged to sustain this ministry's work helping people in our community.
