Do you believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God? And do you wish to participate in the ministry of this church as it serves this community and the world?

Those are the questions I ask any who want to join this congregation as members. We also require the person be baptized, but we accept any prior baptism. Some folks may want to retain their membership elsewhere at another church and so join as associate members. Others may have other reasons for not formally joining, and yet share regularly in worship, fellowship, and service.

Why are you a member? Or why have you not joined? What does membership mean to you? To me, membership shows a level of commitment, saying that this is the congregation where you wish to share in the ministry of Jesus Christ, your spiritual home. But there are more ways to express that commitment than simply making a statement before others on Sunday morning. Participating in worship or bible studies or fellowship events, assisting with children's ministry or helping shelter in a storm, volunteering in the office, or being part of the prayer team—these are all ways to participate in the life of Lake Ozark Christian Church and you don't have to be a formal member to do so!

Currently, one must be a member to vote at congregational meetings, serve on leadership council, be an Elder or Deacon, or serve as chair of a standing committee. At our last Leadership council meeting, we discussed membership. We agreed that membership should not be required to take part in any activity at our church. But we wondered if it was absolutely necessary to hold certain positions. We decided that for Deacons and the chairs of committees, it was not, especially since these people are still selected through a church process. Thus, the council is drafting an amendment to the bylaws to make this change. These changes will be voted upon at the next congregational meeting in November.

Talking of membership, we also agreed that one does not need to come forward on Sunday morning to join the church. Some folks may not feel comfortable coming down the aisle and standing before the congregation on Sunday morning. If you would rather express your commitment to the church in a more private setting, that's fine. Simply talk to me. And even if you just have some questions about membership, I would love to visit with you.

Highlights from the Leadership Council Meeting on September 12, 2024

- There were some maintenance issues:
 - The van back door was fixed
 - Matt Bentz will be contacted about restroom doors (MPR) that are hard to open for someone using walker or wheelchair.
 - Matt Bentz will be contacted about restroom lights which are staying on; they are activated by a motion sensor
- The pickleball group was given permission to purchase a new net with wheels that will be stored in hallway or fellowship hall.
- Permission was given to the DWM to have an extra week to prepare for the annual rummage sale.
- Pastor Ron reported that the After-School program is doing very well; 22 kids have attended with more interested. The Shelter in the Storm agreed to switch rooms with Art room to accommodate this growing ministry. The playground has been cleaned and updated. If the program continues to grow they will need more space. Also, with the growing program, we need to be prepared to offer nursery services on Sunday in case families visit. Volunteers would be appreciated. We will look into using company recommended by Church Mutual Insurance (our carrier) for our background checks.
- Funerals: When a grieving family requests a luncheon, the church will provide fried chicken. Members are expected to provide a side dish or dessert.
- Pastor Ron noted that the nominating committee is having trouble filling positions. There are people who are regular participants who might be interested but are not yet members. The council decided that membership should not be required to be a deacon or chair a committee, and voted to recommend changes to the bylaws which will be voted upon at the November meeting.
- Treasurer Matt Redd provided financial information. We currently are running a deficit of approximately \$27,000. We did pass a deficit budget (-\$12,494) so this is to be expected. Matt shared that he was not terribly alarmed as we tend to make up a lot of ground in December, but it should be watched.

Christmas Shoebox Ministry Planned

Summer is over and the holidays will be here before we know it! Our Disciples Women's Ministry organization will again be sponsoring the Samaritan's Purse Shoebox Ministry. We are asking all members of our congregation to take part. In these uncertain times, it's now more important than ever for children around the world to know that God loves them and has not forgotten them! Our goal is to fill at least 75 shoe boxes!

You can use your own shoe boxes, or we will have some available beginning Sunday, October 6th. You can decide if you want the box to be for a boy or a girl. They can be for a 2-4-year-old, a 5-9-year-old, or a 10-14-year-old. Items to include in the boxes are:

- A "Wow" item such as a doll, soccer ball with pump, or a stuffed animal
- Pack fun items such as toys, cars, jump rope, yo-yo, & musical instruments, etc.
- School Supplies: Pens, pencils, sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, coloring and picture books, solar calculators etc.
- Accessories: socks, sunglasses, jewelry, comb, washcloth, watches, flashlights with extra batteries, flip flops, clothing, etc.

Please do not include candy, toothpaste, gum, used or damaged items or war related items, seeds, food, liquids or lotions, medications, vitamins, glass or breakable items, or aerosol cans.

We asked that you bring your filled shoe boxes to church on either Sunday, November 3rd or November 10th. The boxes will then be taken to our local collection site and will finally be distributed to over 100 countries around the world. Our DWM group will pay a donation of \$10 per box to help cover the processing and shipping costs. Since 1993, Samaritan's Purse has collected and delivered over 220 million shoebox gifts to children in more than 170 countries and territories. Join us in helping make this LOCC project a success to bring Christmas joy and God's love to children around the world!

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE NEWS

The LOCC Transportation Ministry began approximately 4 years ago. Initially, the primary purpose was to assist members of LOCC by providing rides to medical, dental, and physical therapy appointments in Lake Ozark, Osage Beach, Camdenton, Eldon, Jefferson City, and Columbia. A second purpose was to provide rides to members needing transportation assistance in order to attend services at LOCC.

A survey of LOCC's membership was conducted and many members offered to provide transportation to one (1) or more of the locations listed above. Over time, several of our original group of volunteers have relocated, had changes in their family, or unfortunately passed away. This has created a much smaller "pool" of volunteers.

As a result, we are once again asking for volunteers to provide transportation to locations. Please consider helping us by selecting one (1) or more locations on the sign-up sheet at the information table so we can continue to assist LOCC church members.
